



RALLYE AUTOMOBILE PERCE NEIGE MANIWAKI 2010



The Perce Neige Maniwaki rally, the only winter event in the Championship. This rally 45 years old, has always been very popular with the competitors. The long snowy roads used over the years have helped the event develop a great reputation with in the Canadian Rally Championship. Thus accessibility for the spectators has always been a little difficult. Often ran on forestry roads far from any major center, a fair amount of courage was required to overcome the snow and cold temperatures. The Perce-Neige, will not shy away from its usual forestry roads that have made its reputation, nevertheless it will adopt a format accessible to spectators, staying closer to Maniwaki.

The Rallye will start with parc exposé at 9h am in front of the Maxi in down town Maniwaki (Galeries of Maniwaki). This is a great opportunity to see the competitor's cars take the start of the event. Following the official start, the competitors will transit to Égan Sud, for the Marie-Anne spectator stage (starts at 9h40). The teams will go by twice on that road. Next, everybody is off to Messine to run the Farley stage (chemin du Petit Lac des Cèdres, starts 12h00). "We have established the schedule of the rally, so that the spectators that will have seen the Marie-Anne stage in the morning will have time to get to the Farley stage". The spectators going to see the Farley stage; will have to use the FREE shuttle service, that will drive them from the parking area to the spectator points. No cars or walking spectators will be admitted in to the stage.

An another choice the stage "Blue sea/Bouchette" (stats (13h30), no cars will be admitted in to the stage.

After the stages that are ran in the city, the rally will move to the Forêt de l'Aigle. However these roads will be prohibited to spectators for security and accessibility reasons.

The organizations ask that spectators to respect the above guide lines and those given by security volunteers and to park in the appointed parking areas.
